Gethsemane Lutheran Church, 715 Minnetonka Mills Rd., Hopkins **StreetSong MN** is an exciting choir which aims to unite voices for harmony and community. Comprised of persons "experienced in homelessness", i.e. persons currently or formerly homeless and those who care about them, StreetSong is led by Teri Larson and Bill Mathis; Teri is Director of Music of the Basilica of St Mary and Bill is the conductor of several music organizations. This choral collaborative is an enterprise of the Downtown Congregations to End Homelessness.

StreetSong draws on the experiences, hopes, and aspirations of its members to produce a choral experience promoting personal fulfillment and the development of community. A meal is available prior to rehearsal, and bus tokens are provided to remove any financial obstacle which may be a deterrent to participation. Rehearsals take place on Mondays at Central Lutheran Church from 12–1 pm, just after the community meal.

Through its music, StreetSong MN presents an opportunity for engagement in the cause of ending homelessness. The choir has appeared at DCEH's Unite to End Homelessness events, the Central Library in downtown Minneapolis, the Mall of America as part of its Holiday Music Festival, the annual Homeless Memorial March and Service and at various churches and mosques. In April 2016 and May 2018, StreetSong MN performed with the award winning vocal ensemble Cantus at the Ordway Center for the Performing Arts and other venues.

Chorus Polaris is an eclectic community chamber chorus of 45 professional and amateur singers. They sing an extraordinary range of music, from Renaissance motets to jazz to masterworks with orchestra, and they work hard to get out from behind the music, singing with spirit, expression, and skill.

Every singer is vital to their success. Each one of them learns not just the notes, but the style of singing called for in each song in their repertoire. Their rehearsals are richly musical, an exhilarating challenge for the singers that makes their concerts engaging and personal. Chorus Polaris serves as the symphony chorus for the Mississippi Valley Orchestra.

Please join us - On March 3, 2019 the chorus will sing Vaughan Williams' stirring cantata *Dona Nobis Pacem* at Bethel University with the Mississippi Valley Orchestra. In May, they will present a series of concerts entitled Millenia: Psalms Ancient and Modern, featuring Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms*.

William H. Mathis recently retired as Minister of Music and Fine Arts at the Hennepin Ave. United Methodist Church in Minneapolis. A graduate of Westminster Choir College, Bill has served churches and colleges in the Midwest, California, and Oklahoma.

Bill is an active clinician, leading workshops or guest conducting in 35 states, including national events for the American Choral Directors Association, Choristers Guild, the American Guild of Organists, and the Handbell Musicians of America. He is noted for a rehearsal style which leads to musical understanding.

His compositions are found in the catalogues of 15 music publishers. He is currently leading both of these choirs and a professional handbell ensemble called Bells of the Lakes.

Teri Larson, founder and co-conductor of StreetSong-MN, is currently serving her twenty-fifth year as Director of Music at The Basilica of Saint Mary in Minneapolis, Minnesota. She is the founder of the children's choral program at The Basilica, which now serves children from pre-K through high school.

Ms. Larson has served as choral director of the St. Cloud State Concert Choir, St. John's University Chamber Singers, The College of Saint Benedict Women's Choir, the Minnesota Center Chorale and other community choruses. Adjudicator and Festival Honors' Choir conductor, she has served positions in the American Choral Directors Association and is currently on the national Board of Directors for Choristers Guild.

Ms Larson recently conducted a performance with the ecumenical Together in Hope Choir at St. Paul's-Outside-the-Walls, Rome, Italy, to open the XVII Festival Internazionale de Musica e Arte Sacre; this project is devoted to furthering Christian unity.
