'Myths, Legends, and Epics' through the lens of veterans' experience

Landmark Center celebrates World Storytelling Day, March 20

SAINT PAUL, Minn. (Feb. 25, 2019)—Every year, since 2003, World Storytelling Day events take place on or around March 20 in more than 25 countries. Storytelling is often thought of as fairytales, fables, and oral history, but it is also commonly used to foster peace and understanding, community building, healing, and in advocacy work. Each year a global theme complements the principal concept behind WSD, "If I can hear your story, it's harder for me to hate you." This year's global theme is "Myths, Legends, and Epics."

This year's global theme lends itself to the epic struggle of veterans coming home whole: to meaningful life. Odysseus took ten arduous years to return from the Trojan War. Psychiatrist Jonathan Shay documents such heroic journeys in books like *Achilles in Vietnam*. The literature of folklore is littered with legends like the Grimm's *Bearskin*, where a returning soldier suffers valiantly for seven years to win the life he wants and deserves. Finally, real life veteran legends like Jesse Owens and Hugh Thompson are rivaled only by the growing cadre of women veterans daring to stand up to the travesty of military sexual assault.

The event begins at 6 p.m., with information tables outside the F.K. Weyerhaeuser Auditorium, with storytelling and veteran support organizations, Twin Cities PBS, Women Veterans Initiative, Warrior Writers, Rosen Body Work for Veterans, as well as Veterans for Peace (VFP) and other member groups of Minnesota Alliance of Peacemakers. Storytelling begins at 7 p.m. in the F.K. Weyerhaeuser Auditorium. This event is free, but donations to Veteran Resilience Project will be accepted.
